## **50 Steps For Learning Biblical Greek**

A Sequence For The Student Compiled By Roderick Graciano

- 1. Read **Wenham's Introduction to English Grammar** (available from me as a pdf file upon request).
- 2. Memorize the **Greek Alphabet**, and the sounds made by each letter in Modern Greek (p. A-5 in Section A of our Greek syllabus).
- 3. Memorize the eight Greek **Diphthongs** (p. A-6).
- 4. Memorize the eight special **Consonant Combinations** (p. A-7).
- 5. Memorize the 24 forms of the Greek **Definite Article** (p. B-9, Section B of our Greek syllabus). Use the "Greek Definite Article Exercise" posted on Timothy Ministries' "Getting Started With Biblical Greek" web page.
- 6. Acquire and use a copy of Matthew S. DeMoss', *Pocket Dictionary for the Study of New Testament Greek* (InterVarsity Press, 2001).
- 7. Start attending a **Biblical Languages Fellowship** where you can study biblical Greek with others.
- 8. Learn the meaning of **Case** and the uses of the four primary cases (p. B-18 and B-19).
- 9. Learn the 24 forms and meanings of the **Relative Pronoun** (p. B-27).
- 10. Memorize the 8 forms of the **Masculine Noun**, λόγος, (p. B-10).
- 11. Learn the 6 **Conjunctions** and 2 **Negations** (pp. B-6 and B-7).
- 12. Learn the **Prepositions** diagrammed on p. B-22.
- 13. Learn the present, active, indicative of the **Regular Verbs**, λύω and φιλέω (p. B-48).
- 14. Learn the  $\bf Personal\ Pronouns\ (p.\ B-25).$
- 15. Learn the 1 John "**Starter Vocabulary**" (pages D-15 to D-27).
- 16. Make sure that you understand the six kinds of information involved in **Parsing Verbs** (p. B-53).

- 17. Learn the **Future Active** of the verb  $\lambda \dot{\nu} \omega$  (p. B-55).
- 18. Learn the **Aorist Indicative Active & Aorist Subjunctive Active** forms for λύω (p. B-51).
- 19. Familiarize yourself with the **Verbal Aspect, Spatial Qualities and Typical Aktionsart** of the six verb tenses (pp. B-43 to B 46).
- 20. Learn the **Demonstrative Pronouns**, *This* and *That* (p. B-28).
- 21. Memorize the 8 forms of the **Feminine Noun**,  $\dot{\alpha}\rho\chi\dot{\eta}$ , (p. B-24).
- 22. Learn the **Top 100 Words Used In The NT** (p. D-11 to D-13).
- 23. Acquire and use a copy of Johannes P. Louw and Eugene Albert Nida's *Greek-English Lexicon of the New Testament: Based on Semantic Domains* (New York: United Bible Societies, 1996).
- 24. Memorize the 8 forms of the **Neuter Noun**, ἔργον, (p. B-32).
- 25. Learn the forms of the **Adjective** ἀγαθός (B-35).
- 26. Learn the process for **converting Adjectives to Adverbs** (p. B-38).
- 27. Learn the Interrogative & Indefinite Pronouns (B-27).
- 28. Learn the difference between **Nesting And Stacking Modifiers** in biblical texts (p. B-37).
- 29. Memorize the four **Moods** and their significance (pp. B-41 and B-42).
- 30. Learn the **Present And Aorist Active Imperative** forms of the verb λύω (p. B-57).
- 31. Learn the **Present Subjunctive Mood** of the verb λύω (p. B-49).
- 32. Learn the forms of the **Feminine Nouns (First Declension in Alpha)**, ἡμέρα and δόξα (p. B-31).
- 33. Learn the four endings of Greek **Infinitives** (p. B-67; D-38).
- 34. Learn the **Present Participle Active** for λύω (p. B-63).
- 35. Make sure that you understand the seven kinds of information involved in **Parsing Participles** (p. B-53).
- 36. Learn the **First Aorist Participle Active** for  $\lambda \dot{\nu} \omega$  (p. B-64).

- 37. Memorize the **Principal Parts for Regular & Irregular Verbs** (p. B-54).
- 38. Finish your first reading of the entire Greek New Testament.
- 39. Invest in *Logos*® or *BibleWorks*® software to aid your study of Greek.
- 40. Use Greek often in your background study for teaching and preaching, and start studying passages in the Greek Old Testament (Septuagint).
- 41. Learn the **Present Active Participle** for Eiµί (p. B-66).
- 42. Learn the **First Aorist Participle Passive** for λύω (p. B-64).
- 43. Learn the **Perfect Participle Active** for λύω (p. B-64).
- 44. Continue to study the details and subtleties of Koine Greek in Rodney J. Decker's, *Reading Koine Greek: An Introduction and Integrated Workbook* (Grand Rapids, MI: Baker Academic, 2014).
- 45. **Lead your own Biblical Languages Fellowship** for people from you church and neighborhood. Nothing will help you learn Greek like teaching what you know to others.
- 46. As you begin a second read-through of the Greek New Testament, select favorite verses to memorize in Greek.
- 47. Read Constantine R. Campbell's, *Basics of Verbal Aspect in Biblical Greek* (Grand Rapids, MI: Zondervan, 2008), in order to get a good handle on verbal aspect and *aktionsart*.
- 48. Study sections of interest in Daniel B. Wallace's *Greek Grammar* beyond the Basics: An Exegetical Syntax of the New Testament (Grand Rapids, MI: Zondervan, 1996).
- 49. Finish your second read-through of the Greek New Testament.
- 50. Start alternating between New Testament and Old Testament (Septuagint) texts in your continuing study of biblical Greek.
